- Per Florida Statutes 99.095 petition figures are based on at least 1% of the total number of registered voters of that geographical area as of the book closing figures from the last general election
- Special District Offices need only 25 valid petitions.

Did you know?

- You may complete the repetitive fields such as Candidate's Name, Office, County and State.
- You may make corrections the voter entered to any field except their signature and the date signed.
- Make sure the correct and only one of the party boxes are checked. If a voter writes their party for a nonpartisan office, you may cross through, initial and mark the correct (nonpartisan) box.
- Petitions must be originals, no emails, faxes or copies may be submitted.
- Only voters are to fill in the date signed portion.
- The zip code is the only field that may be left blank and not invalidate the petition.
- Do not wait to submit petitions to our office, bring them in groups of 50 - 500 as you receive them.
- Bring your campaign check when submitting your petitions for verification – cost is 10¢ per petition.
- Make sure petition form is the latest from the Division of Elections. It is the candidate's responsibility to insure this.
- Take a few minutes to look over the petitions before submitting them. Candidates may correct anything except the voter's signature and the date they signed it.
- Once the petitions are turned in candidates may not have them returned.
